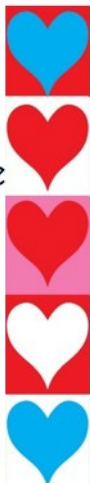


February 3

in times of trouble.

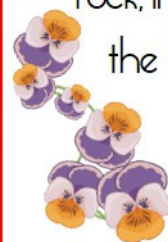
